

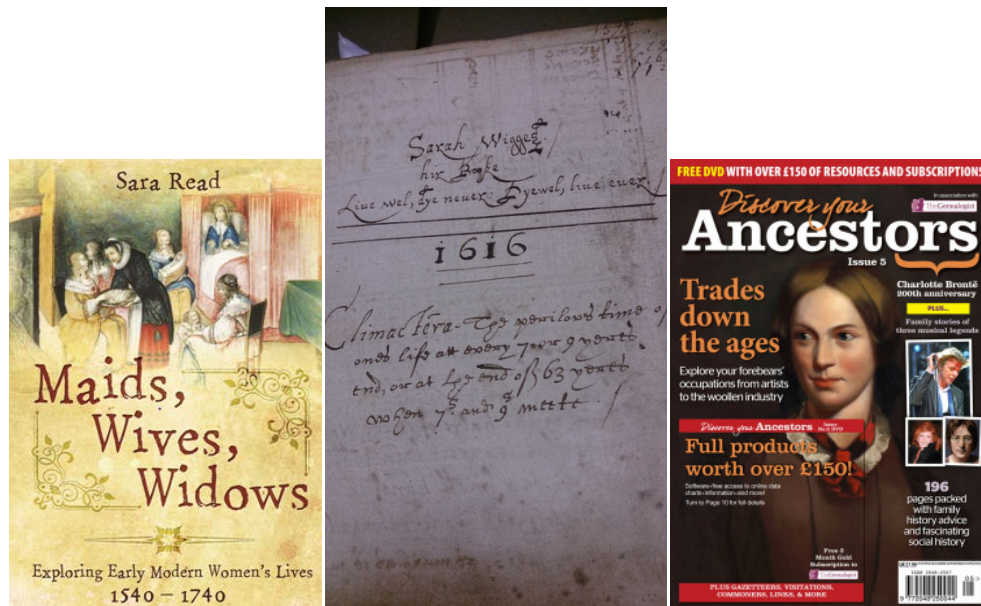


Finding your Ancestors
